Easy access to poorly secured medications opens the potential for drug diversion that can result in DEA investigations and fines.

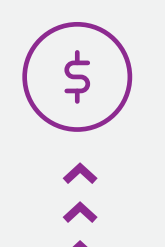


One survey reported the prevalence of controlled substance abuse in the OR at **9.8%**<sup>2</sup>



### Cost control

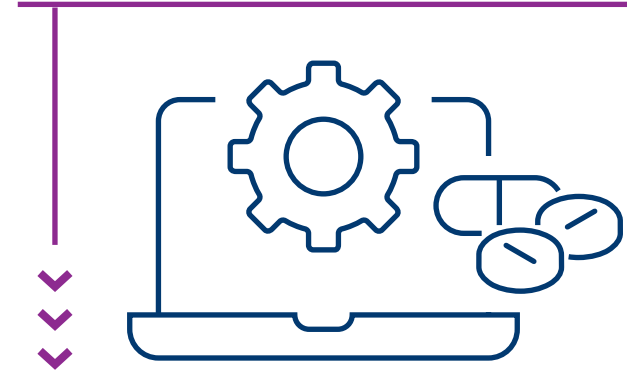

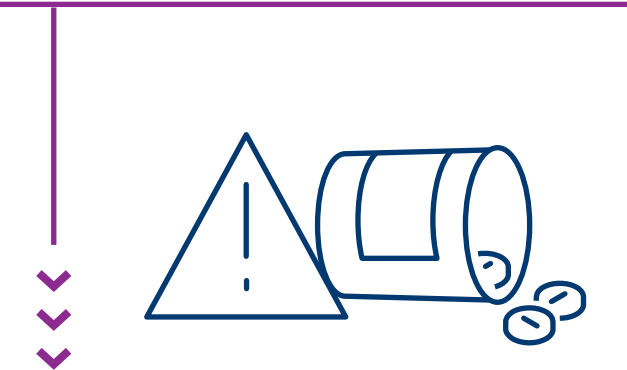
