Q What will this congress attempt to accomplish?

- A Updating of current best practice in injection technique by those working in the field, including the results of a world-wide injection questionnaire survey with over 13 000 respondents from 41 countries.
 - Open discussion on current practice issues and potential recommendations
 - Identifying research gaps and brainstorming on future research needs in this field

Q Where & when will it take place?

A Hotel Crown Plaza, Rome, Italy from Friday October 23rd, to Sunday October 25th.

Q Language used:

All plenary sessions and workshops will be in English.

Q How will the conference be organised?

A Plenary sessions will be held in the mornings (CET), aimed at updating the group on the current best practice in the field of injection in diabetes.

Workshops on specific topics will take place in the afternoons (CET).

There will also be the opportunity to dialogue informally with experts in the area of injection.

Q Who will be physically present at the congress?

A Attendance is very selective, limited to 150 professionals (doctors, nurses and educators) from across the world, acknowledged to be actively interested in the field of injection technique, safety and infusion and in a position to influence best practice in their region.

Q Is the purpose of the meeting purely scientific?

A Yes, no product promotion or other commercial aims are part of the objectives. As in the previous meetings, the promotion of BEST PRACTICE and achieving better PATIENT OUTCOMES are the primary and ultimate goals.

Q What is the publication strategy?

A Our strategy is to publish practical, evidence-based recommendations for insulin injection and insulin infusion, in a major peer-reviewed medical journal.

Q Who is funding this event?

A BD is sponsoring the congress.


